

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ABOUT THE COLLEGE



A symbol of knowledge, splendour, achievements and perseverance, Dyal Singh Evening College has left no stone unturned in developing cognizance of students' problems and assisting the students in every possible way to make them reach the zenith of success. The institution was established in the capital city in the year 1958, by the great philanthropist, Sardar Dyal Singh Majithia, founder of the newspaper The Tribune and Punjab National Bank. Currently, there are six undergraduate courses across various streams that the prestigious institution offers. It is one of the few colleges of the University of Delhi where Modern Indian Languages like Punjabi, Urdu, Tamil and ancient languages such as Sanskrit are being taught. The college was converted into a full-fledged day college in the year 2018. At present, there are over 3000 students enrolled in the college, excelling not only in academics but also in co-curricular activities.





College Profile

Standing like a beacon in the heart of the city, Dyal Singh Evening College represents a synthesis of tradition and modernity and it is this characteristic that is encapsulated in its motto. The rich legacy of the institution can be traced back to the vision of its founder Sardar Dyal Singh Majithia, remembered as the founder of The Tribune and the Punjab National Bank. Hailing from Punjab, one of the great sons of India, he wanted to infuse a scientific outlook in the minds of the people ridden with blind faith and superstition. For this purpose Sardar Dyal Singh willed his estate for the establishment of an educational trust for a secular college, and in 1910 Dyal Singh College Lahore was established. Post-partition, the Trust set up by him kept his vision alive in India as well. An eminent educationist, late Dewan Anand Kumar, the former Vice-Chancellor of Punjab University, immortalized Dyal Singh Majithia, by establishing two academic colleges in his name: one at Karnal and the other at Delhi. It started functioning in the capital as constituent college of the university of Delhi in 1958 and was taken over by the university of Delhi as a university maintained institution in 1978.

The college offers Five undergraduate courses in disciplines ranging from languages, history, political science, economics, commerce to all the major branches of arts and commerce. There are presently around 3000 students on the rolls of the College.

The college has a vibrant and spacious campus and is well connected by Delhi Metro. It has well-equipped lecture halls, extensive lawns and vast play-grounds. The college also boasts of a unique open air amphitheatre surrounded by majestic trees. The college has a heavy duty generator to augment the supply of electricity in the event of a power failure. The infrastructure has witnessed expansion owing to the increasing student strength. In addition to the construction of a New Academic Block which has several class rooms, a new computer lab, a state of the art Seminar Hall, and an aesthetically designed Auditorium have also been built.

The college provides meaningful, value-based education to students, some of whom come from humble backgrounds. Special relaxation in cut off is given to girl students during admissions to empower them by encouraging them to pursue education while working. Similar relaxation is given to students opting to study languages like Punjabi, Urdu, Tamil, and Sanskrit to keep alive the rich diversity of cultures of our country. This is both a challenge as well as a matter of pride for the college.

LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT

The college library has constantly helped teachers and students alike to become well-versed in diverse domains of academia. Over 72,142 books, 1204 of which were added during the academic year 2022–2023 are currently available in the library. The library also provides users with thirteen different newspapers and twenty-two periodicals. The library offers electronic resources for teachers and students through its membership in N-list, INFLIBNET, UGC, and the Delhi University Library System.

THE ARTS AND CULTURE SOCIETY: SPANDAN

Dyal Singh Evening College's Art and Culture Association is a society that supports college cultural pursuits like drama, music, fine arts, folk dance, and Western dance. COMHUB, the Commerce Society of Dyal Singh Evening College conducts various conceptual sessions, cultural events, fests, trips, and much more, for the holistic development of the students of the commerce department.

More than 40 events were organized by Comhub in the academic year 2022–23. Students from various courses, classes, and colleges participated in these activities throughout the year. Some of the notable events are:

- Comhub organized an intuitive international webinar on the topic "Covid-19 Pandemic and its Impact". The speaker for the same was Dr. Mayukh Bhattacharya who is currently working as a general practitioner in East London. Another webinar was hosted on the revealing topic, “Business Analysis”. The speaker for the session was Mr. Atul Grover, who is working as a Senior Business Consultant at DXC Technology, UK.
- Comhub hosted more than fifteen webinars in the session 2022–23. - Comhub organized its first-ever boot camp program on March 23rd and 24th, 2023. The program had four webinars on the topics "Digital Marketing", "Personality Development and Communication Skills", "Project Finance" and "3 Lies about Entrepreneurship". The event had the participation of over 300 students from various colleges and streams. These workshops were conducted by professionals and experts in collaboration with professional institutes and offered the students a more pluralistic makeover.
- Comhub held its eighth edition of Sharing Warmth in observance of Swami Vivekananda's birth anniversary. By assisting those in need, the students avowed to make the world a better place to live. This was an initiative taken by the team in good faith to carry on the traditions of humanity.
- A Mini-Fest of Comhub, 'Radiance 23', was organized on the 14th and 15th day of February to provide students with fun and joy coupled with practical experiences. It included an extravaganza of fun events, insightful seminars, and a variety of stalls full of delicacies.
- Comhub hosted its annual mega fest, 'Comfiesta'23: The Carnival of Commerce' on 20th and 21st day of April 2023. Seven exciting corporate games and events were organized as part of the comfiesta. The winning participants for each event were felicitated with cash prizes, goodies, certificates, and exciting gifts. Multiple stalls were set up on the college ground. A footfall of more than 2000 students was recorded and the social media posts covering the events received a high amount of engagement. Comfiesta'23 was meant as a two-day escape for students away from their daily routines and has once again proved to be an emblem of innovation, ideation, and inspiration.

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

The Department of Environmental Studies of Dyal Singh Evening College conducted several events during the academic session 2022-2023. These events aimed to raise awareness and promote practical solutions to burgeoning environmental challenges.

Brainstorming session on the occasion of World Environment Day 2022

One of the significant events organized by the department was a brainstorming session on “How can we make our city sustainable? “. The session was conducted on 5th June 2022 on the occasion of world environment day and was attended by more than 35 participants including students and faculty members from various departments. The session covered topics such as sustainable urban development, urban green spaces, biodiversity conservation in urban areas, etc. The keynote speaker, Mr. Harmik Singh, Field Biologist at Kamla Nehru Biodiversity Park (DDA Biodiversity Parks of Delhi) discussed the latest research and practices in urban ecosystem management and highlighted the importance of incorporating environmental considerations in urban planning and policy-making.

Plantation Drive

Another event organized by the department was a plantation drive. The Department encouraged the students as well as faculty members to participate actively in the plantation drive. The drive aimed to promote the importance of native plants in maintaining local biodiversity and ecosystem. The event was held on 18th August 2022 and was attended by students of every department, the reverent Principal as well as faculty members of the college. The participants planted saplings of native plant species on the college campus. The Chief Guest, Dr. A.K. Singh, Scientist In-Charge, KNR Biodiversity Parks Program, University of Delhi donated native plants to the department for the plantation drive in the college. In addition to this, he also delivered a lecture on the importance of native plants in biodiversity

conservation. The event was successful in promoting environmental awareness and encouraging practical actions towards sustainability.

Field Trip on the occasion of World Wetlands Day

The department organized a field trip for the students to Yamuna Biodiversity Park to celebrate world wetlands day 2023. The field trip aimed to give the students practical exposure to wetland ecosystems and biodiversity conservation efforts. The trip was held on 2nd February 2023 and more than 30 students from various courses of the college went to witness and learn about the nature and ecosystem. The students were accompanied by Dr. Sarthak Malhotra and Dr. Sandeep K Malyan from the Department of Environmental Studies. In the beginning, students visited the shallow wetlands area of the Biodiversity Park where a series of lectures were delivered by experts in the field. The first speaker was Professor C.R. Babu, former Pro Vice-chancellor of the University of Delhi, Presently Professor Emeritus and Project In-charge Biodiversity Parks program at the University of Delhi. He delivered a lecture on the importance of wetland ecosystems. Prof Yamini Gupta enlightened students on the economics of wetlands. Prof. R.S. Sharma's enriching talk on wetlands as a source of livelihood was keenly listened to by the students. The keynote address was delivered by Rajeev Kumar Tiwari, Principal Commissioner, Delhi Development Authority, on the significance of wetlands.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English, Dyal Singh Evening College conducted several events during the academic session 2022-2023.

- Literary Meditations, the English society of Dyal Singh Evening College, organized its first offline competition after COVID-19 in the Seminar hall, on 29th September 2022. Events that took place were: Slam Poetry, Lit Quiz, and Turn Coat debate, where students across all the courses participated and showcased their talent.
- The Department of English organized an insightful Departmental Orientation in the Seminar Hall on 9th November 2022. An enriching session was provided to the students on the syllabus of English Honours and they were guided regarding the diverse options they can choose under the New Education Policy framework.

Report of Lit Fest, 2023

The Department of English, Dyal Singh Evening College organized a two-day annual literary fest, 'Litrospect'23' under the aegis of Literary Mediations on 19th and 20th April 2023.

Following events and competitions were organized for the fest:-

1. Twist The Tale.

Twist The Tale Competition was the first event in an exciting series of competitions.

The participants were given a tale and they had to twist it to make it relevant to contemporary times.

2. Soliloquy Competition.

Esteemed judges for this event were Dr. Setlu and Dr. Chetna Sharma from the Department of English, Swami Shraddhanand College.

The participants enacted the roles of famous literary figures. Parts of plays like Hamlet and Faustus were recreated, and Marlyn Monroes' speech along with self-written pieces was showcased. This event provided an opportunity for the students to display their brilliant oratory skills, understanding of characterization, and knowledge. Over 20 participants vied in this contest.

3. Author Speaks

Prof. Nandini Sahu, an Indian poet and creative writer, the Director, School of Foreign Languages, and Professor of English at Indira Gandhi National Open University [IGNOU], New Delhi was the speaker for the event.

Prof Sahu shared her creative journey and experiences that helped in shaping her multi-facet personality, i.e. as a creative writer, an academician, and various personal roles she performs. She emphasized the idea of empathy as a vital force for creative inspiration, the experiential nature of literature, the romance of library culture which is dying these days, and various other experiences.

4. Lit Quiz

The event had the audience equally engaged as the questions of rapid-fire were asked in this.

5. Turncoat Debate Competition

The participants were given the topics on the spot and they had to argue for and against the motion. Students engaged in this contest and displayed their oratory skills and knowledge. The presence of the

esteemed judges, Dr. Moumita Sarkar and Dr. Sangeeta added to the prestige of the competition and provided the participants with valuable feedback.

6. Slam Poetry

The judges for the event were Antara Vashistha, an alumnus of our college, and Ronojoy Sircar, a renowned writer, photographer, filmmaker, and musician.

Participants presented their poetry, abiding by the following themes: Heteronormality and Deviance, Body Standards/ Self-Worth, Hustle Culture, Unseasonal Rains, and Power of Vulnerability.

7. Nazaria: A Short Film-Making Competition

The participants had to make a 4-minute short film in a minimum of 4 hours related to the themes that were revealed on the spot. The given themes were:

Department of History

'**The History Society**' was established and its logo was released by the principal. The inaugural function '**Yugantar**' of 'The History Society' was organized. Yugantar is the Annual festival of the Department of History under the aegis of which various intra-college and inter-college seminars, conferences, and other academic activities are being organized.

A **Workshop on Site** was organized at Purana Qila in coordination with Dr. Vasant Swarnkar from the Archaeological Survey of India who is supervising the current excavations. It was attended by a team of seven faculty members and 150 students. Our team was briefed about various aspects of archaeology and the nature of findings from the different archaeological sites.

Dhara Mitra, the Environment Awareness Committee.

Dhara Mitra, the Environment Awareness Committee of Dyal Singh (Eve) College actively engages with issues concerning the environment and climate change. In the academic year 2022-2023, we have been working towards raising awareness amongst the new batch of students with our ten-point awareness agenda. Meetings with students were held in the first quarter of the year to spread the ten points taken up in the agenda regarding- noise pollution, air pollution, people pollution, need for non-violence not only towards humans but towards plants and animals as well.

On December 1, 2022, fifteen Dhara Mitra students participated in a program on Environmental Justice, Water Conservation, and Sustainable Living at India International Centre, New Delhi.

On January 18, 2023, the Committee organized a day-long symposium on 'Environment Awareness through Art and Culture' in which Shri Sopan Joshi, a

renowned author, and environmentalist; Amit Kalla, an artist, and poet, Dr. Reela Hota, Odissi danseuse and scholar, Dr. Ajeet Kumar, Dept. of Sanskrit made their presentations on climate change; environment, painting and healing; spirituality and environment; and Environment awareness in Sanskrit literature respectively. Our in-house moderators were Dr. Ashok Singh, Dept. of History, Dr. Anshuman Singh, Dept. of English, Dr. Ambika Nayyar, Dept. of Commerce, and Dr. Nitumoni Kakoti, Dept. of Political Science. Our esteemed Principal, Prof. Pawan Kumar Sharma, inaugurated the program.

THE PLACEMENT CELL

Performance Overview 2022-23:

In the current session, The Placement Cell hosted 309 companies, out of which, 176 were for Internship opportunities and 133 were for Placement opportunities. The cell achieved an astounding 300% increase in the total number of companies hosted from last year. In addition, 153 students got selected for various internships and Placement opportunities. The highest offered Cost to the Company (CTC) was 23 LPA by D.E. Shaw and the highest stipend offered was 30,000 INR per month by The Leading Solutions.

The Cell also organized a multitude of seminars and webinars to ensure the skill enhancement of our students. Some of the seminars include CAT Demystified by Career Launcher, How to Crack UPSC Exam by Chanakya IAS, Studying Abroad made easy by Upschol, and many others. The Placement Cell also organized its annual flagship event i.e. The Internship Fair. It was held in an offline mode with the State Bank of India as the Title sponsor and TVS Motor as the Associate sponsor. In addition, 36 companies were on board for this marquee event. Many students from some of the most renowned colleges like Hindu, Ramjas, SRCC, LSR, Sri Venkateshwara, etc attended the internship fair.

The main highlights of The Internship Fair are as follows:

- Total selected students: 389
- The average package offered: 5.5 LPA
- The highest package offered: 23 LPA

- The highest stipend offered: 30K

The gender ratio of the students placed: Female - 53%, Male - 47%

The cell received a total of 4,388 registrations for the Internship Fair 6.0 and received a massive footfall of 1,879 students. During the Internship Fair, the cell conducted 3,794 interviews in a hybrid mode out of which 389 candidates were selected.

Forum for International and National Awareness, F.I.N.A.

F.I.N.A. (Forum for International and National Awareness) of Dyal Singh (Eve) College, organized a symposium on **Borderline Confusions: Lessons from History** on Jan 17, 2023, to look back at post-Independence years of the Nehruvian Government and how the Indian borders with China were left unattended and problems regarding them were deliberately overlooked.

The word 'Borderline' is deliberately used in the title as a pun to suggest the ambiguity. The objective of this symposium had been to make our students aware of historical *faux pas* that led to complications in our political ties with our neighboring countries.

Eminent authors and speakers were invited as resource persons and speakers. With guidance and support from our honorable Principal Prof. Pawan Kumar Sharma, Shri Avatar Singh Bhasin; ex Diplomat and author, Prof. Shrikanth Kondapalli; School of International Studies, JNU, and Dr. Antara Datta, Janki Devi Memorial College, DU, spoke on Nehru's inadequate border policies, Indo-Chinese contemporary border situation, and ephemeral borders for Moghul-era travel scholars. Prof. Pawan Kumar Sharma gave the welcome address and Dr. Alka Tyagi made the introductory remarks for setting up the tone for the seminar. Besides the in-depth presentations by the above-mentioned scholars, significant deliberations were put forward by in-house scholars including Shri Shashi Shekhar, Dr. Shivani Singh, Ms. Ekta Shaikh, Prof. Hemant Mishra, and Dr. Sujeet Thakur.
