


HOW YMH WORKS

A series of institutional-level events in schools, colleges and universities to crack the country's growth story by identifying and rectifying socio-economic factors across 5 tasks assigned to them and outcomes identified by Yuvamanthan and suggest strategies to supercharge India's growth story. These 5 broad tasks are

Discuss how these elements can contribute to future-proofing India's growth story and identify new avenues that can drive the nation towards success.
- 2. India's Clarion Call Slogans for growth: Communications strategy for developing growth mindsets in masses. Students will work in teams to refine their ideas and craft a slogan that effectively communicates the essence of growth mindsets for a developed nation. Encourage them to keep the slogans concise, catchy, and Impactful. As an optional extension, students can develop an implementation plan for the chosen slogans, outlining strategies for disseminating them to the masses through various communication channels such as social media, traditional media, community outreach programs, or educational initiatives.
- 3. Namaste Bharat Learning through history: Strategies for inviting tourism and activities based on India's history, spirituality, cultural diversity and ancient knowledge. In this hackathon task, students are challenged to develop a comprehensive strategy to attract tourists and promote activities centred around India's captivating history, spiritual heritage, and ancient wisdom. Students will explore innovative approaches to highlight India's cultural treasures and create immersive experiences that showcase its unique heritage to a global audience.
- 4. Being Social Bridging socio-economic gaps: Ensuring equal opportunity, inclusivity and dignity while removing urban-rural, inter-religious, inter-state, gender, standard of living or any other gap that may exist. Students to devise projects or initiatives that tackle pressing social issues and inequalities in India. ORGANISATION OF YUVAMANTHAN EXPERENTIAL LEARNING EVENTS





Through Yuvamanthan's experiential learning programmes

- The students will participate in actual simulations of large plenary meetings. They will act like political party members, young innovators, diplomats for various countries and young innovators to discuss and create strategies and solutions to deal with India's growth challenges and opportunities.
- Yuvamanthan will create a dedicated landing page for the theme India @2047, where all the information on the vision is provided along with video messages of the Honourable Ministers for participating students.
- Participating students and teachers will be invited to take an e-Pledge based on the honourable Prime Minister's Panch Prans.
- The students who wish to participate will take an 'Orientation Courses on Government Initiatives' which will
 discuss India's achievements and challenges.
- 5. Yuvamanthan will be creating comprehensive Background Guides on the themes highlighting the country's achievements in the past decade. The Background Guides will provide information on all government initiatives like Digital India, an Aadhar Mobile, Swamitva Yojana, Digital Locker, e-NAM, Umang, Smart Cities Mission, CoWin, Vaccine Diplomacy, Hriday Scheme, PRASHAD, Scheme, Jan Dhan Yojana, Ujjwala Yojana, Stand Up India, Mudra Yojana, Ayushman Bharat, Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana PMJAY, National Health Mission, Mission Indradhanush among others and will help to participate students to get a perspective of the theme.
- At the end of each event, Yuvamanthan will share a comprehensive report detailing the event. Yuvamanthan
 will share draft resolutions/communique of each event with the ministry and a report in the prescribed
 format.

Participating in Yuvamanthan Experiential Programmes

- Institutes can participate in Yuvamanthan events by visiting <u>www.yuvamanthan.org/registration</u>, clicking on the 'Register' button and following the Instructions as outlined. [Following Registration, a Step by Step guide would be emailed.] If an institute has already conducted Yuvamanthan Model G20 (YMG20) it does not have to register again.
- The institutions will then choose the event they wish to participate in and register for each event following the process required.
- Appointing a 'Teacher/Faculty Coordinator' who will help coordinate the YuvaManthan events.
- 4. The Teacher/Faculty Coordinator will appoint 4-5 'Students Coordinators' who will be referred to as the 'Secretariat'. The Secretariat is responsible to help the Faculty Coordinator in the organisation and logistics of various activities.
- The Teacher/Faculty Coordinator will also select up to 10 students who will act like journalists for the events.
 They will act as Photographers, Reporters and Carlcaturists.
- 6. The institute or teacher coordinator will invite students to participate in the by :
 - Sharing Web Link/QR Code provided on the institution dashboard with all students/teachers to make them create their YuvaManthan account. A separate Web Link for Teacher/Students have been provided.
 - The institute can also upload a CSV file of all students/teachers to help them create their Yuvamanthan accounts.
 - If the institute has already conducted YMG20 it can select existing students to participate or add new students by following the above instruction.
- The students will take 'Orientation Courses' for each event which are 15-minute e-Modules that are followed by a quiz. To be eligible to participate the students will have to score at least 60% or above in these quizzes.
- The Teacher Coordinators will select between 20-100 students for participation and will provide them with Background Guides on the themes for each of the meetings to help them prepare.
- 9. The institutes will also invite Jury members to judge the events through our portal.
- 10. At the end of each event, a document called Draft Resolution or a Communique is created by the students that highlights all the proceedings of the discussions and the proposed solutions to the issues at hand.
- The institute will submit the photos, videos and Draft Resolutions of the event through their dashboard.
 Yuvamanthan will share pictures, videos and draft resolutions of each event.
